Pastoral Letter - Holy Land Accompaniment

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

We are all filled with anguish at the terrible suffering which is currently being inflicted upon the people of Gaza, especially on children and women. I recognise that the situation in Palestine and Israel is very complex but terrible atrocities are occurring within Gaza.

We can feel helpless in the face of such suffering and the sin which causes it

Recently I was approached by a priest and lay woman from our diocese who expressed such feelings of helplessness and wondered if there was any way we could support those who are suffering. After discussion among ourselves and residents of the Holy Land we believe that, as a diocese, we could accompany those who wish it with prayer and listening.

I know that some will question the value of listening and prayer when so much practical assistance is necessary. For twenty five years I have been privileged to visit, and live among, people suffering from the injustices of utter poverty and war. Often I felt I had little or even nothing to offer them. Yet repeatedly I am astonished at the response from those who are vulnerable and feel discarded when someone accompanies them - they experience their true dignity as a human person and the hope which springs from that. No value can be put on this.

Advocacy is important and there are several Catholic bodies engaged in this. I am proposing accompaniment: listening, sharing and prayer. Our contacts in the Holy Land have responded positively and want a bond with the people of our diocese. They agree that our accompaniment would be ecumenical and open to contact across faiths and borders
